

LET'S TALK ABOUT IT

“Mysteries: Clues to Who We Are”

This very popular series is provided by The Friends of The Library Southport/Oak Island (FOLSOI) and the North Carolina Humanities Council. The project is made possible by a grant from the North Carolina Humanities Council along with a matching grant from FOLSOI.

Registration for the four-part series will be held on **January 9, 2017 at Harper Library**. Registration must be conducted in person at the Harper Library or by phone. Due to the popularity of the program, you may only register for yourself and one other.

The sessions will be held on January 26, February 9, February 23, and March 9, beginning promptly at 2 PM and concluding at 4 PM. Each of the four sessions will be held in the Meeting Room of the Harper Library. Prior to each session, participants will receive a copy of the book and a list of questions/discussion ideas from each scholar pertaining to the book. Our guest scholar for each session will provide a presentation about the book and author. After a short break, the scholar will lead an open discussion about the book. Books are returned after each session, and the next books are distributed.

“Silent Clowns in Epic Events”

Chaplin and Keaton March 20th

Comedy is not usually found in the same context with the heroic and the tragic, but silent film era clowns Charlie Chaplin and Buster Keaton thought why not? The result was their two masterworks: Chaplin's *The Gold Rush* (1925), about the 1890s Klondike gold discovery, and Keaton's *The General* (1927), about a Union railroad plot in the Civil War.

Join John Whiting, professor emeritus, SUNY Orange, at Barbee Library on Monday, March 20 from 10 a.m. to noon when he presents his topic **Silent Clowns in Epic Events**. He will discuss and demonstrate how the movies' comedic aspects and serious elements are integrated to create a complex unity.


