# Message from President Susan Pryon

Summer is almost upon us, and the FOLSOI are pleased to announce that we are once again sponsoring the annual Summer Youth Programs. The library staff has been hard at work selecting and scheduling a nice variety of activities for this summer. If you have or know some children who would like to participate, be sure to read the article found in this issue for details.

Children and young people's services have been a focus of ours since October. The library staff informed us last fall that they were looking to expand services to children as well as provide activities that will occupy children while their parents are browsing the collection or by tutors to supplement skill work. To this end, we financed the purchase of an Early Literacy Station (ELS) for each library to enhance the skills of children aged 2 – 8. Because the ELS is a closed system (no Internet), parents do not need to fear that their children will accidently end up on an undesirable website. The ELS features more than 60 top-rated educational software programs spanning seven curricular areas. All of the programs are kid-friendly and require no technical support. If you haven't used the ELS for your child or grandchild, please stop by either library to give it a try.

While writing this letter I took a call from a library patron who is moving and cannot take her personal library with her. She asked if we could send someone to collect her books for our monthly book sale. The answer was "Yes!" Please think of us if you find yourself in a similar situation. We are happy to take your books, CDs, and audiobooks and will come to your home to get them if needed. The FOLSOI could not provide the library with the kind of support described above without the generous donations of people like you.

Thanks to all of you who have donated even one book or who have become a member of the FOLSOI.

The decisions expanded the present library holdings and were made with input from library personnel, parents, teachers, and, most importantly, the expressed requests of young readers themselves.

Titles such as Henry Winkler's <u>Hank Zipper</u>, Ursula Vernon's <u>Dragonbreath</u>, Adam J. Epstien's <u>The Familiers</u>, Steven Brezenoff's <u>Field Trip Mysteries</u>, Dan Gutman's <u>My Weirder School</u>, and even <u>Captain Underpants</u> by Dave Pilkey will adorn shelves by the time this publication reaches our membership. DVDs bring to children and their families the ever popular: *Peter Pan, Jungle Book, Tigger*, and *Aristocrats*, while the more recent stars of the small screen include: *Cars, Finding Nemo, Madagascar, Frozen, Ice Age*, and *Tangled*.

The special reading collections will be identified with Ms. Cunningham's full name and the inscription, "Sharing the Joy of Reading." The DVDs will also be labeled with Ms. Cunningham's name. In a final effort to reach as many children as possible, we will fund one of this summer's reading program events presented by Mad Science of Myrtle Beach, entitled "Fire and Ice."

In learning more about Ms. Cunningham, we found she was most recently employed as a "greeter" at Southport's Wal-Mart. With tears in her eyes, a coworker described Ms. Cunningham as kind, outgoing, and caring. She was known as a person who was friendly to the people she came in contact with and was noted as a genuinely interested listener.

We thank again Cara June Cunningham's family for giving FOLSOI the honor of remembering their mother.










# SAVE THE DATE Tuesday, September 23
